

2017 will be a more exciting year... **EXPECT GREAT THINGS TO COME.**



He's been called rattan's first virtuoso. But children living near SM Seaside City Cebu in the Philippines likely refer to him as really cool. It's at that five-story mega-mall by Arquitectonica that furniture designer Kenneth Cobonpue has created Sky Play, a fantastical 1/2-acre rooftop playground. Placed on top of swaths of green artificial turf or blue synthetic rubber are 25 climb-worthy structures that began as sketches of a make-believe underwater world. Cobonpue says that he initially took up design to be a kid forever: "Designing this is a return to my childhood imagination, where gigantic dinosaurs roamed the land, and sea clams provided shelter to sailors and mermaids." Since the site is surrounded by underprivileged neighborhoods, the park also serves as a safe place for less-fortunate kids to literally let their imaginations run wild.



FASTCAT PARTNERS WITH Philippine Maritime Institute

TO TRAIN ASPIRING CADETS

In their continuous pursuit to build up globally competitive seafarers, Archipelago Philippine Ferries Corporation or FastCat, partners with Philippine Maritime Institute to train students to be skilled and knowledgeable in the maritime industry.

Equipped with the most modern facilities and highly competent officers, FastCat - owner and operator of Roll On/Roll Off (RoRo) vessels - opened their services to train students of Philippine Maritime Institute schools, namely, Philippine Nautical and Technological Colleges (PNTC) and West Bay College while under the supervision of Archipelago Philippine Seafarers Training Institute Inc. (APSTII).





their students to APFC for cadetship training," said FastCat EVP, Mary Ann Pastrana. "The partnership became a solution to the problem of maritime schools on where to send their students for training, and it also became a way for FastCat to have a pool of qualified and well-trained crew." FastCat has gained trust from maritime institutions for their efforts in modernizing catamaran vessels that adapt to weather conditions and needs in the Philippines. Their experiences and resources make them the most ideal training ground for cadets.

"Our academic executives appreciated the Shipboard Training activities that APSTII submitted to us. FastCat vessels are also well-equipped with modern facilities, similar to our own, so our students can experience real things," said PNTC Shipboard Training Officer Mario Tiu. Shipboard Training Officer Tenioso Abanil of West Bay College also said, "FastCat has very competent officers whom I believe can be trusted when it comes to training cadets."

The training program accommodates up to 220 cadets per year distributed among ten vessels. Numbers will increase as FastCat adds more vessels to their fleet. "We are increasing our capacity for shipboard training via a blended learning in our classrooms and in our training facility found near the port," said Pastrana. "We are also in the process of converting one of our ships into a full pledged training vessel which can accommodate as much as 3,000 students."

Cadets must follow the learning objective prescribed by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED). They will perform duties in-line with the shifting schedule of FastCat crew members and officers under the supervision of the Vessel Master. Through this partnership, aspiring cadets will also be given the chance to become part of FastCat's crew after they graduate.

In 2015, FastCat granted three aspiring seafarers a chance to pursue a life of productive seamanship through the Cadet & Ratings Educational Assistance Program of Scorpio Transport and Manning Services, Inc. The aim of the program is to assist cadets in achieving full accreditation by undergoing necessary training. The three scholars were also given the privilege of working for FastCat.

Now, FastCat further expands their efforts in training students so they can be up to par with global standards. They aim to have their crew members, and aspiring crew members, to keep on learning about the best maritime practices to ensure every passenger with trips that are "Ferry Safe, Ferry Fast and Ferry Convenient".

Local Businesses Credit FastCat For Sea Transport Improvements and Economic Gains



Archipelago Philippine Ferries Corporation (APFC), or FastCat, has been making sea travel faster, easier and safer for Filipinos since 2002. The company owns and operates the Philippines' first and only catamaran Roll-on/Roll-off (RoRo) ferries, and operates modernized ports and terminals in the eastern and western Philippine sea route.

In 2010, FastCat took on a re-fleeting program that adds 30 brand new catamaran vessels and several new routes connecting different provinces to further aid both local trade and leisure travelers who consider sea transport as a more economical and viable option. FastCat's innovative efforts have helped establish strong and long-standing partnerships that have produced improvements and gains in the way many local businesses are run.

FAST For a hundred years, Philtranco has been operating to provide transportation for people traveling to different areas of the country. "In our business, the RoRo facilities are very important," shares VP of Operations, *Rodelio Domingo*. "Before partnering with FastCat, we used to have a hard time crossing [waters] because of the poor vessel services. Waiting time was 3 to 6 hours, which was terrible for passengers." He goes on to explain that when there are delays, their buses are unable to return on time, and this causes loss of business for Philtranco.



Since moving their business to FastCat, Philtranco has seen a huge improvement. Waiting time was greatly reduced, facilities are comfortable and clean, and travel time has been cut down due to the speed of the vessels. "Passenger convenience was promoted," adds Domingo. "From the point of embarkation to the pier, passengers go straight to the FastCat vessel. No hassle, no lines." Moving forward, Philtranco hopes FastCat can help them reach farther provinces of the Philippines.

CONVENIENT "Our business has been transporting consumer goods, food and non-food, and raw materials from Metro Manila to Western Visayas, with our base being in Panay, for 10 years already," says Complete Logistics Control Inc. Marketing Manager *Buddy Silva*. Their company's former RoRo provider would give them just 4 to 5 slots a day, therefore, some of their trucks would be left behind or stalled.



"In our business, turnover is important. The more and quicker we are able to deliver, the better." That's why when Silva's company used FastCat, which was able to accommodate and provide them more slots, business improved significantly. Silva also greatly appreciates that FastCat offers convenience even for their payment options. "The online payment is very useful for us, kasi based kami sa Panay." Add to that, transactions are quicker, according to him.

SAFE FastCat gives exceptional service to all its passengers. Fedelin Manalon, a banana dealer at the Alabang Public Market is a believer of FastCat. To ensure his products make it safe and on time, Manalon uses FastCat to get his trucks through the long journey from Bulalacao, Roxas to Alabang, Metro Manila.



He says that the first thing he noticed about the ferry company is that they're fast and efficient, and the process is orderly. "Maganda ang patakaran nila. Naging priority kami sa FastCat," Manalon shares, noting that there is a lot of care given to all the passengers and cargo on board.

With all its ferries targeted to be completed by 2020, FastCat is poised to support even more local businesses, in line with one of its main missions. As APFC Chief Executive Officer, *Christopher Pastrana* says, "We want every Filipino to enjoy a Ferry Safe, Ferry Fast and Ferry Convenient trip". New routes and more vessels only mean there will be more businesses and travelers who can benefit from the safety, speed, and convenience that FastCat provides.

- Cut or portion the cream cheese into 2 and form into balls. Roll in some flour and then chill.
- Meanwhile form the beef mixture into 2 balls.
- Then insert in the middle of the beef ball one cream cheese ball.
- Flatten into a patty making sure the cream cheese is not oozing out.
- Keep burger patty chilled till ready to pan-fry.
- Enjoy this as a burger steak, sandwich or topping on mashed potatoes.

GO, FIGHT, WIN!





Boiled, grilled, fried, stewed, mashed, sweetened, milked, spiced up, steamed, peeled or not, glazed with sugar coating, dusted with sugar, stuffed in meats, kamote is so versatile --- you can make a whole cookbook out of it.

For me, I like kamote to go with any kind of adobo... in place of potatoes. Because kamote has that kind of umami-sweetness that potato doesn't have. Why not substitute kamote for potatoes in dishes like Caldereta, Pochero, Mashed Potatoes, French Fries, Potato Salad...

Get to know more about kamote--- here are some more trivia:

- It is one of the oldest vegetables, so maybe the cavemen ate it.
- Origin Central America.
- Varieties: in flesh (white, yellow, violet or orange). In skin color (white, red, violet, yellow or orange).
- You can blender cooked kamote, but you can't (and don't even try) do the same for potatoes or else the potatoes will become rubbery and tangle the blender.
- Been known to help avoid stroke by bringing down the harmful effects of low-density cholesterol and preventing blood clots.
- Has high amount of potassium and low glycemic index.
- Did you know that kamote can be eaten raw with skin? Just wash it with clean, cold water.
- Kamotes are different from yams. Yams are much bigger, kamotes have thinner peel.

LET ME SHARE A RECIPE FOR KAMOTE:

Spicy Kamote-Monggo Soup (Good for 6-8)

1 pc. Spanish chorizo, sliced diagonally 250 gms. boiled kamote, peeled, cubed 250 gms. boiled monggo 4 C chicken or beef broth siling labuyo (depends on how much you can tolerate) olive oil green herbs

- Heat oil and brown the chorizo and chili.
- Let chorizo's oil turn the olive oil to orange.
- Gently sauté kamote and monggo till incorporated.
- In a separate pot, bring broth to a boil, then simmer.
- When boiling, add the kamote, chorizo and monggo.
- Drizzle the orange oil on the soup.
- Use green herbs as garnish. Serve hot!
